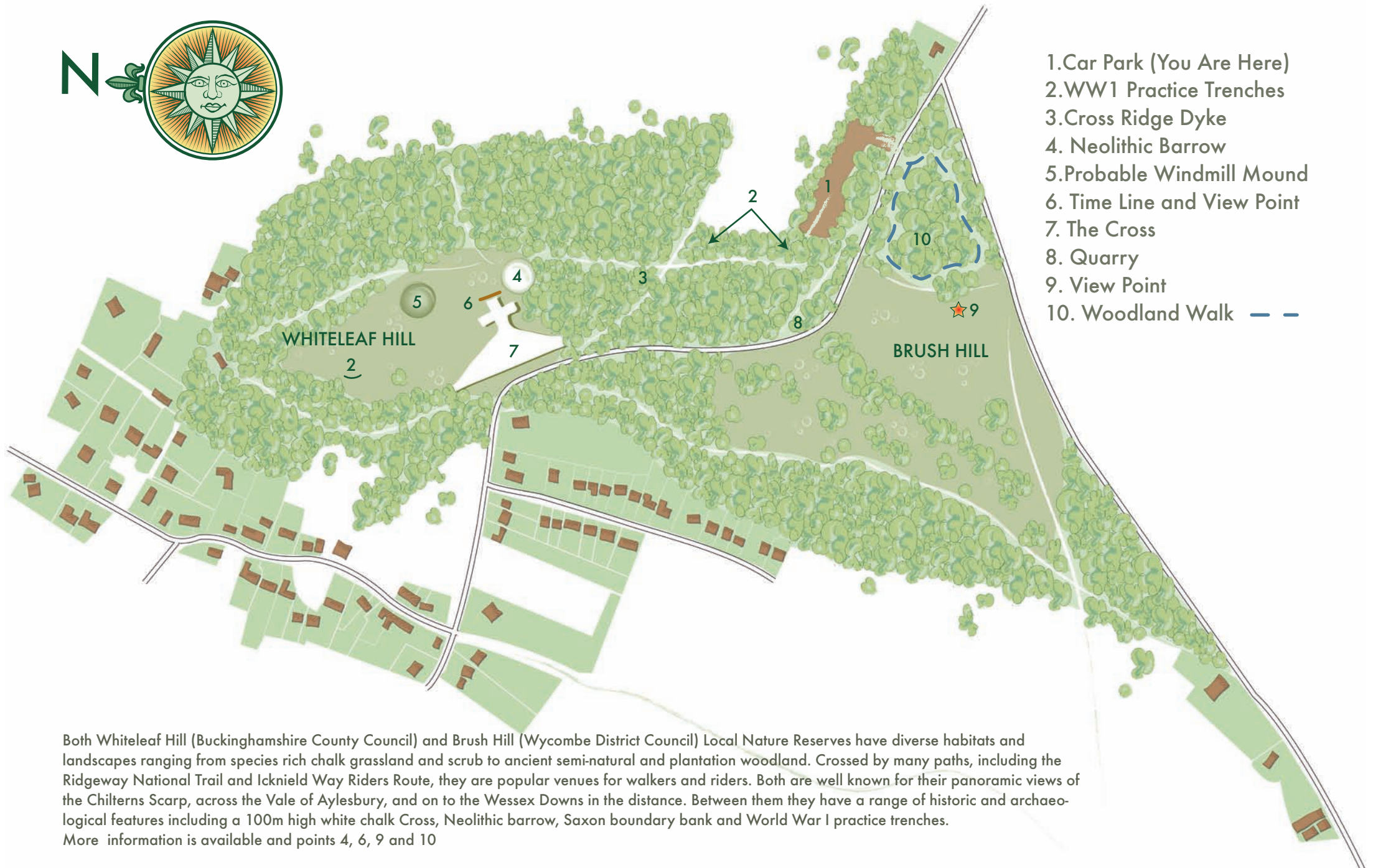


WHITELEAF AND BRUSH HILL LOCAL NATURE RESERVES

Both Whiteleaf Hill (Buckinghamshire County Council) and Brush Hill (Wycombe District Council) Local Nature Reserves have diverse habitats and landscapes ranging from species rich chalk grassland and scrub to ancient semi-natural and plantation woodland. Crossed by many paths, including the Ridgeway National Trail and Icknield Way Riders Route, they are popular venues for walkers and riders. Both are well known for their panoramic views of the Chilterns Scarp, across the Vale of Aylesbury, and on to the Wessex Downs in the distance. Between them they have a range of historic and archaeological features including a 100m high white chalk Cross, Neolithic barrow, Saxon boundary bank and World War I practice trenches.
