



Restoration proposals

Conservation in the wider parkland -We aim to conserve and restore important parkland tree groups and views across the parkland. A full tree survey will look at their historic significance, some date back to the medieval deer park, and some reveal the influence of Lancelot 'Capability' Brown.

View to Windsor Castle and temple base - The temple base will be conserved so the view to Windsor Castle can be fully appreciated with the steps, stonework and surfaces restored to protect the structure and interpret this important historic vista. A survey and design for the temple base has been completed.

Langley Lake - The serpentine lake will be restored to the original Lancelot 'Capability' Brown design.

Temple gardens - Twentieth century rhododendron gardens will be restored and access improved. Survey shows first plantings where about 1870, with interesting cross hybrids circa 1915.

Visitor facilities - Visitors will see improvements to the car park entrance, more interpretation information and a new visitor resource facility in the shape of a new building which will include toilets, a tool store and a refreshment kiosk.

New and improved access, signage and information - Improve footpaths, and bridleways, signage and information.

Arboretum - The Arboretum will be restored and preserved with new fencing signage and planting.
